Revelation 2:6 But this thou hast, that thou hatest the deeds of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.

1Peter 4:18 And if the righteous scarcely be saved, where shall the ungodly and the sinner appear?

You see, God HATES the SIN but LOVES the sinner.

God promises, all those who live Godly in Christ Jesus, SHALL suffer persecution. 2Timothey 3:12

This is a promise, they will call you a Hippocratic, self righteous, or so spiritually minded your no earthly good.

- 43 Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy.
- 44 But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;
- 45 That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he maketh his sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust.
- 47 And if ye salute your brethren only, what do ye more than others? do not even the publicans so?

Romans 7:19 For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do.
