

Matthew 7:1-2 Judge not, that ye be not judged.

For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged: and with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again.

Romans 8:1* There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.

Jesus bore the entire WRATH of God that we deserved through the LAW, on the cross of calvary. Through our faith in Jesus, God the father can only see the righteousness of his son shining out of us. The Holy Spirit only convicts us of our unbelief in Jesus. So why do we condemn what others say they have seen or done.

Did not the Pharisees condemn the deciples for eating corn without washing their hands. (it has absolutely nothing to do with our salvation)

Colosians 2:16* Let no man therefore judge you in meat, or in drink, or in respect of an holyday, or of the new moon, or of the sabbath days

1Corinthians 11:29* For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.

Romans 14:14*I know, and am persuaded by the Lord Jesus, that there is nothing unclean of itself: but to him that esteemeth any thing to be unclean, to him it is unclean.

James 4:17* Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin.

What I'm trying to point out, is that it is not up to us to condemn others or judge their heart but to lead by love and example.

We make the same mistakes as the Scribes and Pharisees, we look at the outward appearance instead of the things we can't see.

Those of us that have tasted of the good things of God, have no problem seeing the errors in many main stream religions. **But** where we make our mistake is instead of talking to the individual on a private or one on one basis. We bring it out in public (and I'm not talking here about a sermon being preached) which can bring condemnation or misunderstandings.

John 3:11* Verily, verily, I say unto thee, We speak that we do know, and testify that we have seen; and ye receive not our witness.

Acts 4:20 For we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard.

When someone says they they had a dream or a vision

WHO are WE to say no you didn't, just because it doesn't line up with our conception of what we think it should be.

1Corinthians 14:32* And the spirits of the prophets are subject to the prophets.

In other words we are unique individuals, the Holy Spirit will show us or enlighten us according to the unique way he created us.

We ALL make mistakes and the word teaches we are not to be so thin skinned and be forgiving and longsuffering like his example.

Romans 2:4* Or despisest thou the riches of his goodness and forbearance and longsuffering; not knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance?

This will apply to each one of us.

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
