<u>John 1:19</u> And this is the record of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, Who art thou? <u>21*</u> And they asked him, What then? Art thou Elias? And he saith, I am not. Art thou that prophet? And he answered, No. <u>22</u> Then said they unto him, Who art thou? that we may give an answer to them that sent us. What sayest thou of thyself? <u>23*</u> He said, I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness, Make straight the way of the Lord,

Now I am in NO WAY trying to relate myself to John the baptist, but I can relate to him. As I have shared before, I was supposed to be aborted, but due to my mothers prayers and faith. I was filled with the Holy Spirit in my mothers womb when she was six months pregnant and at my earliest remembrance, when mom would lead us in devotions, I was too young to talk much, but I would talk in what I come to know as my pretend language. Now mom was born again but Knew nothing of the anointing of the Holy Spirit and speaking in tongues. All she new is that at six months, God filled me with the Holy Spirit and she was healed. (Luke 1:41)

At the age of six, I was forbidden to use baby talk or what I called, my pretend language. But in private I would still use it occasionally even until I got married. In 1971, God showed me it was the Heavenly language he gave me when I was born. I have always known that I was called of God to minister his word, but that it wasn't until the time, just before his second coming.

In 1971, through the gift of Prophesy, someone said, it is time to go out and get your feet wet. Meaning to me, it was time to go out and preach what he had taught me. So for seven years we traveled around sharing the word and power of God. As well as forming three no denomination churches, of which two are still going today but they have joined denominations.

While growing up, we had no church back in the sticks, just the various denominations that would venture out occasionally. I didn't know at the time but there were Lutherans, Pentecostals, Baptists and just traveling Evangelists. I knew there was a difference between their actions but they All talked about Jesus and I loved Jesus.

In 1949 the folks moved into town and I went to Sunday School at the Mission Covenant Church, the Baptist and the Salvation Army, And I really didn't know that one thought they were more enlightened then the other till I was close to my teens.

In the 70's is when I really Started to seek the Lord just as to what he had called and prepared me for. A little at a time he kept showing me that the denominations were dividing the kingdom of God and not building it. There were several prophesies said over me, that I would be like a voice in the wilderness. I would not minster to the masses, but the few. There would be multitudes that would hear and respond to the message I share, but I was not to see the full results thereof. I always share the Gospel, the love and deliverance of Christ, but no matter how nice I try to be, I'm always compelled to share that there will be no denominations in Heaven. For all those that cling to their denominational beliefs and teachings WILL lose out. The bible does say:

<u>Galatians 3:25-28</u>* But after that faith is come, we are no longer under a schoolmaster.

<u>26</u>* For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus. <u>28</u>* There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for ye are all one in Christ Jesus.

Colossians 1:18* And he is the head of the body, the church:

"You see" IF you believe IN Christ and that he is the same yesterday, today, and forever and that he is the church, then it don't matter much which evangelical denomination you attend. <u>Matthew 7:13-14</u>

BUT - if you follow the teachings of most denominations that say, that was for then and not today or that was fulfilled or we don't believe that or have embraced modern changes into the assembly. YOU WILL wind up with your denomination in Hell.

The Lord is coming back for those that love and trust him, nothing less. (<u>Matthew 7:21</u>*)
