1. What does it mean to be loyal to someone?

It has several meanings, Faithful: True to the fact or teaching, Dedicated: You do not keep score, like keeping brownie points. You work towards a common goal. Devoted: It is a part of your belief or concern. You follow the teachings of the bible, as the Holy Spirit teaches you. **1Jo 2:27** and not just man. **Col 2:8**

A Friend - Most marriages today Fail because they don't know how to be a friend to their spouse, if your a friend, you will overlook their short comings and will let it go in one ear and out the other. (Jesus does) Also a TRUE FRIEND will not turn a blind eye or keep quiet if you are doing something that is detrimental to your spiritual growth or you are diminishing your integrity.

AFTER ALL, a spouse cannot have short comings, THEY ARE YOUR SPOUSE. 2. What's the difference between a friend and Jesus?

A human friend will at some point, dissolution you by not being honest with you or saying something against you. A true friend will tell you the truth or avoid your question. They will not say "It looks good on you," when its not true. Many friends are what is called, Fair Weather Friends, you know, as long as your beneficial to them and their ego and do not disagree with them.

AFTER ALL, They have feelings too.

Jesus on the other hand is one who, "sticks closer than a brother" (**Prov18:24**) He will not lie to you, forsake you, nor get angry with you nor condemn you, even when you don't listen to him. He will not shrug his shoulders at you, nor in anyway make you feel stupid or inferior. YOU HAVE NO PROBLEM DOING THAT TO YOURSELF. When we are told the truth, and feel condemned (whether by the word or a friend) it is our OWN conscience that condemns us, NOBODY ELSE.

He is a gentleman he don't shout or get ticked off.

3. What happens when we think we are accomplishing things for God?

Well first of all, judge yourself, **2Co 13:5**, check your motives, your desires and do they line up with what the word teaches?

Are you trusting the Spirit of God, or are you trusting in your natural mind and abilities? **Ga 6:3** For if a man think himself to be something, when he is nothing he deceiveth himself. (Carnal mind)

How do you find the balance between confidence in your abilities and dependence on God? **Php 4:13** I can do all things through Christ which strengthenth me.
