They do not believe the bible, but rather their tradition. IN OTHER WORDS, THEY DON'T LET THE BIBLE GET IN THE WAY, OF WHAT THEY BELIEVE!

A common theme among younger people is that they see less value in being part of a church community. On the other hand, young and old alike, do crave to establish meaningful relationships with others. It should be a priority for congregations to intentionally create the environment and opportunities to help people connect with one another in meaningful ways. Back when rock-n-roll started there was a big conflict about whether or not the church should embrace rock-n-roll. You walk into some churches and you would swear you're in a rock concert, the music and the DRUMS are so loud you can't understand what is being said.
